Hi Camper,

The following is a list of items you will need at Camp for the week. Be sure to check the list before you leave home:

- Black ink pen
- Pajamas
- Sleeping bag or two blankets and pillow
- Minimum of **EIGHT (8)** plain white T-shirts with lasta name stenciled in **BLACK** permanent ink on the front and back of shirt in **1” block stencil**
- Swimwear (one-piece for females, short style for males)
- Jacket or sweatshirt
- Raincoat / Rain gear
- Toothbrush, toothpaste, soap, deodorant, shampoo, mouthwash
- Shower towels and wash clothes
- Underwear (for 1 week)
- Socks (for 1 week)
- Tissues or hankie
- Bug Spray
- Minimum of 2 pair of running shoes or athletic type of shoe (preferable for running / exercising)
- Flashlight
- Shower shoes

“ALL CLOTHING AND BEDDING SHOULD BE PLAIN MARKED”

The following are items which you are NOT permitted to bring to Camp:

- **Money, Radio, CD Player, TV, Comic books, cigarettes, snuff, tobacco products, food, gum, knives, firearms, or any other type of weapon**

NO JEWELRY of any kind will be permitted, other than medical alert jewelry. No chains or ropes will be permitted to hang from clothing. Shorts will be provided by the Camp and will be required to be worn around the waist. The six white T-shirts, which campers are to bring with them, will be marked across the front and back with the campers last name, with **BLACK** permanent marker, prior to the campers arrival at Camp.

Room assignments are made to avoid placing Campers from the same area together in groups. Learning to adjust in a new group and making new friends is one of the finest and most profitable experiences camping has to offer. Please do not ask for special assignments.

Campers are not permitted any visitors; even parental visits are discouraged. If absolutely necessary, they should be brief and so timed that they do not interfere with the Camp program.

The Medical and Release forms you received at the orientation meeting must be completed and brought to Camp the first day.

Any Medications brought to Camp must be in the original bottle with a readable prescription.
